About Dave

Dave Middlebrook invented the textmapping method and pioneered the use of scrolls and textmapping for classroom instruction. He has been collaborating in classrooms and conducting workshops for teachers since 1994, and is the founder of The Textmapping Project.

Dave's work is informed by his own experiences with ADHD, auditory processing and working memory deficits, dyslexia, dysgraphia and a few other specific learning disabilities, which have required him to approach reading, writing, and thinking from new and innovative directions. Today, Dave's work is used in the United States and abroad, across the curriculum and in classrooms at all levels, from preschool through university and adult continuing education, in mainstream and special needs classrooms, and for second language learners.

Scrolls and textmapping are cited in books and standards documents and are a popular topic of discussion on listservs and social media. Dave has been an invited speaker at conferences organized by the International Literacy Association, the College Reading and Learning Association, the New Jersey Reading Association, the Michigan Reading Association, the Council for Learning Disabilities, the Council for Exceptional Children, and many others.
